Science Based Drug Education (SBDE)



SBDE provides a three and a half days (28 hours) course to personnel in substance abuse related fields including, but not limited to Prevention, Education, Treatment, and Enforcement. The course focuses on substance abuse trends, the impact on the brain according to science based research, and the resulting consequences to the individual and society including the following topics: general drug groups, history, trends, physical and behavioral effects, adolescent involvement, brain structure and development, neuro-adaptation caused by substance abuse, most popular substance abuse and future trends, and recognizing symptomatic substance abuse behavior. SBDE is a 3.5 days in length. Curriculum allows attendees to build their own presentation to fit their presentation style and audience. Credited for 28 hours of Alcohol and Drug Specific Iowa Board of Substance Abuse certification.
